Consultation with Town and Parish Councils on Dog Control Orders

Wednesday 13 March 2014 -Wednesday 30 April 2014

1. Introduction

Central Bedfordshire Council seeks to promote responsible dog ownership. We recognise that the vast majority of dog owners are caring and considerate as to the effect their dog has on others.

One of the key issues in relation to promoting responsible dog ownership is tackling the problem of dog fouling – allowing a dog to foul and not clearing up after it. Although research by Keep Britain Tidy¹ reveals that dog fouling has reduced in the last 10 years, we acknowledge that where fouling is present it can be very noticeable and unpleasant, and has potential health implications e.g. the contraction of Toxocariasis.

The Council currently provides over six hundred dog waste bins and also accepts bagged dog waste in normal waste bins. We place public information signage in hot-spot areas highlighting the requirement to clear up after a dog has fouled, and run educational campaigns such as 'bag it and bin it' to encourage responsible dog ownership.

In addition the Council employs two dog wardens who not only meet our statutory obligations around stray dogs, but also support dog owners with education and guidance across a range of issues including fouling, barking and general dog behaviour and care. In the past year the Council has issued four Fixed Penalty Notices for offences of dog fouling.

2. Background

Dog fouling across Central Bedfordshire is an offence made by an order under regulations provided by the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996. Orders were made in 1998 by Mid and South Bedfordshire District Councils. Some Town and Parish Councils have also made dog related bye-laws, including the prohibition of dogs from certain areas e.g. playing fields or enclosed children's play areas.

The existing legislative framework is fragmented, limited in scope, and no longer fit for purpose. Significant types of land are not covered by the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 e.g. woodland, heath, common land, agricultural land, and land adjoining a highway where the speed limit is in excess of 40 mph. The specific areas covered by bye-laws are unclear, opportunities for enforcement are limited, and offences may not be able to be dealt with by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice. It also does not allow for effective additional control measures such as for dogs to be kept on leads in defined areas.

Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2005

The Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act (CNEA) 2005 repealed the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996: since 6 April 2006 no new land can be designated, although existing designations made up to that date can still be enforced. At the same time it withdrew the ability to introduce new dog related bye-laws. Sections 55 and 56 of the CNEA 2005 introduced the Dog Control Orders (Procedures) Regulations 2006 and the Dog Control Orders (Prescribed Offences and Penalties) Regulations 2006.

¹ Local Environment Quality Survey of England (LEQSE) carried out between April 2012 and March 2013 on behalf of Keep Britain Tidy: in a survey of 10,000 sites in 2012 only 7% had dog fouling present, a reduction from the 10% found in 2001.

A Dog Control Order can be made by a primary authority (Unitary Council) and secondary authority (Town or Parish Council). It can cover any land which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access (with or without payment). Land which a Dog Control Order covers will replace any order made under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 and any bye-law dealing with the same offence on the same land.

Dog Control Orders provide for the following five offences:

- a. Failing to remove dog faeces
- b. Not keeping a dog on a lead
- c. Not putting, and keeping, a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer
- d. Permitting a dog to enter land from which dogs are excluded or
- e. Taking more than a specified number of dogs onto land.

The penalty for committing an offence contained in a Dog Control Order is a maximum fine of £1,000 (level 3 on the standard scale). Alternatively the opportunity to pay a Fixed Penalty Notice of £80 may be offered in place of prosecution. This can be reduced to £50 if paid within 14 days. DEFRA guidance states that an authority shall not issue a Fixed Penalty Notice unless it is prepared to support a prosecution in the event of a failure to pay.

One Dog Control Order currently exists in Central Bedfordshire. Clifton Parish Council has made a Dogs Exclusion Order for a playing field.

3. Our proposal

The regulations require as a first step that primary and secondary authorities consult each other before making a Dog Control Order. Central Bedfordshire Council is therefore consulting all Town and Parish Councils on the following proposed orders for land which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled to have access whether on payment or otherwise - this excludes Forestry Commission Land² which is exempt from the legislation but includes access land as defined by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000:

a. Fouling of land by Dogs Order

This order will make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to remove dog foul.

The following are examples of the type of land to which this order would apply to: Parks, public open spaces, town centres, roads, pavements, public footpaths, byways, bridleways, woodlands, agricultural land, access land and common land.

b. Dogs on Lead Order

This order will make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to ensure that it is on a lead of no more than 2 metres on any land to which this order applies.

(Under the Road Traffic Act 1988 it is already an offence for a person to cause or permit a dog to be on a public footway or grass verge adjacent to a road without it being on a lead.)

² Forestry Commission Land includes Stanford Wood, Maulden Wood, Rowney Warrren, Home Wood, Chicksands Wood, Potton Wood and Dedmansey Wood.

The order will apply to land which is used as a cemetery, burial ground, garden of remembrance, and marked sports pitches. Additionally at countryside sites it will apply to some car parks and high use areas, including picnic site areas where wildlife is sensitive to disturbance by dogs and grazing areas - these restrictions may be seasonal.

c. Dogs on Lead by Direction Order

This order will make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to put that dog on a lead, and keep it on a lead, by direction of an authorised officer³ on any land to which the order applies.

It will apply across the whole of Central Bedfordshire. The order will enable an authorised officer to respond to a situation where a dog is not under proper control and is likely to cause a nuisance or disturbance to other people or animals.

d. Dogs Exclusion Order

This order will make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to permit the dog to enter or remain in an exclusion area.

It will restrict dogs from all enclosed children's play areas and enclosed multi-use games areas. Additionally at countryside sites it will apply to sensitive wildlife areas, education areas and areas of designated recreational use.

e. Specified Number of Dogs onto Land Order

This order will make it an offence for a person in charge of dogs to take more than the maximum number of dogs specified on to any land to which this order applies. Advice from the Dept. for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) is that the maximum should not exceed six.

This order will only be made by exception to deal with a very local problem. There are no such areas identified at the commencement of this consultation.

Dog Control Orders provide exemptions in particular cases for registered blind people, deaf people, and for other people with disabilities who make use of trained assistance dogs. Additionally no offence will be committed if a person has a reasonable excuse for failing to comply with an order, or the person in control of the land has consented to his failing to do so.

These proposals seek to strike a balance between the interests of those in charge of dogs and those affected by the activities of dogs, bearing in mind the need for people, in particular children, to have access to dog-free areas and areas where dogs are kept under proper control, and the need for those in charge of dogs to have access to areas where they can exercise their dogs without undue restriction. It also recognises that any order made requires enforcement and that the Council has a limited amount of resource available for this purpose.

Signs will be erected to advise those in charge of dogs of the relevant restrictions in their locality.

³ A authorised officer is one so authorised by a primary or secondary authority. Those authorised by a secondary authority must satisfy certain conditions relating to training.

4. The consultation process

Central Bedfordshire Council welcomes your response to the proposed Orders. The first consultation, which is only with Town and Parish Councils and our Local Access Forum, will be open for comment from 13 March to 30 April 2014.

We will then review your feedback, amend the proposals if necessary and then launch a public consultation from 26 May to July 6 2014. You will also be able to have your say during the public consultation.

 - 2.2. The Licensee will keep installed a pair of removable bollards, for which keys will be required
 - 2.3. In accordance with the Company's wishes the type 1 hardcore will be removed after the period of occupation. The area will be ploughed if required by the Company, that by the Company
 - 2.4. Existing trees on site to be protected.

- 3.0 THE Licensee hereby undertakes with the Company as follows:-
 - (a) To keep the land clean & tidy and in the case of any damage or injury caused by them to the said land forthwith at their own expense make good the same.
 - (b) To keep the Company indemnified against all actions claims and demands that may be forthwith brought or made against the Company by any person or persons by reason of anything done by the Licensees in exercise or purported exercise of the right and liberty hereby granted.

(c) Not to use the land otherwise than for the purpose as detailed in paragraph 1.



Friars Walk

The footpath in Friars Walk is to be replaced. Other areas of the estate need attention and could be included in the Top Ten Streets.

New Road / Station Road

A closure notice has been requested for resurfacing work.

Waste

Current recycling rate is 50% with a target of 60% by 2020.

The contract for disposal of waste is currently being reviewed.

BUPA Contract

BUPA has given up its contract so that CBC is now running all the homes like Alison House. These establishments are no longer considered as "fit for purpose" and in the longer term will be replaced as extra-care facilities.

RSPB Wind Turbine

This has been given planning permission.

Biggleswade Hospital

Average occupancy rate is 7 patients although the capacity is 35 beds. All patients are female. A review is taking place.

Sandy Council Police Report 20/02/14-03/04/14.

There has been 2 **Domestic Burglaries** recorded in this period. One was access through the rear, a few coins and cigarettes were taken. The second the unsecured porch door was entered but entry wasn't gained into the main home, nothing taken.

Violence against the person, 11 were recorded, this includes domestic incidents, 1 incident didn't happen in Sandy and neighbourhood disputes.

There has been 1 Burglary other; this was entry into a garage although nothing was taken.

Vehicle Crime, 10 have been recorded including Index plates and hub caps stolen, 2 vehicles were stolen from their driveways; Beacons were stolen from 2 separate vehicles, tools from a work vehicle and items stolen from BMW's. There appears to be an increase in; Theft from Vehicle were BMW's are targeted.

Other Theft is shoplifting, making off without payment; also a pupil had their mobile stolen. Milk was stolen from a school, an item taken when a company were expecting a parcel collection.

There were 10 **Criminal Damage** reports which include Criminal Damage to vehicles; this includes wind mirrors being damaged, 2 x glass panels smashed, a cupboard in a communal area of some flats and damage caused by an ex-partner.

There was also 1 Street Caution for Cannabis.

Other than some series of BMW's being broken into there are no other Crimes that appear to follow a pattern.

We have had a very positive response regarding Speedwatch this month, so we are moving forward and hopefully soon will have a Speedwatch team in Sandy.


