#### REPORTS

#### 5 New Road Clerk's Report

At a meeting on 29 July 2013 Sandy Town Council agreed to give consideration to a proposal to apply to CBC for match funding for pavement along the length of New Road to the A1.

The request for pavement along the length of New Road was considered during consultations on the Biggleswade and Sandy LATPC refresh which took place in 2012 but has not been included for funding in the near future as it did not meet the priority criteria.

Match funding is available to some parishes from CBC's Local Transport Plan Rural Area Matched Fund. A total of £375,000 is being made available during 2014/15 to match fund schemes put forward by parishes which focus on integrated transport schemes. The scheme is intended for rural areas. The criteria for match funding are available on the CBC website, at first sight it is difficult to see how the request for pavement in New Road could comply with these criteria. Also the project would be an expensive one and parishes are expected to contribute up to £50,000 of the cost of projects. The greater the parish contribution the greater the chance of success. The deadline for applications for 2014/15 was 31 July 2013 (two days after the STC meeting at which the resolution was approved) therefore this scheme could only be considered for 2015/16.

A further consideration is whether it is advisable to encourage pedestrians to walk all the way to the end of New Road to then cross the A1. Alternative pedestrian routes are directed towards the footbridge which is a safer crossing point and the lack of pavement may encourage walkers to use these footpaths.

#### 7 Bedford Road Recreation Ground - Trees Deputy Clerk's Report

The Town Council is continually contacted by some of the residents of Albion Court whose properties have a boundary with Bedford Road Recreation Ground about the Lime and Maple trees which grow adjacent to the boundary. The resident(s) would like the trees to be less dense (crowns of the trees thinned to allow more light) and the trees to be cut back closer to the metal fence line, so that growth never goes further than the individual gardens wooden fence (which is approximately 1 metre closer to the properties than the metal fence line).

One of the residents from Albion Court who has communicated with the Town Clerk has said that they will pay for the work to the tree nearest to their property. The resident could make an application to Central Bedfordshire Council to carry out tree work to the tree and then CBC would have to consult with the Town Council about the application, before they made a decision.

The alternate Lime and Maple trees were initially planted approximately 1.8 metres from the boundary line and the trunks are now between approximately 1.2 metres and 1.5 metres from the boundary line.

Members may recall that Bedford Road Recreation Ground is within Central Bedfordshire Council's conservation area for Sandy. In addition the Lime and Maple trees are protected by Tree Preservation Order No.20, 2002 from Mid Beds District Council (Central Bedfordshire Council) and all tree works have to be approved by the planning section of Central Bedfordshire Council.

Below is what can be found on the Central Bedfordshire Council website about Tree Preservation Orders (TPO).

http://www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/planning/trees-andlandscaping/default.aspx The objective of a TPO is to protect trees that make a significant impact on their surroundings, for example, if they form an important feature within the local landscape, or if they have an historical association with the local area.

A TPO can be made in respect of an individual tree, a group of trees or woodland including hedgerow trees but not hedges, bushes or shrubs.

Exceptions: The removal of dead branches from living trees has been included in the list of excepted work, work to dangerous trees is also excepted to the extent that such works are urgently necessary to remove an immediate risk of serious harm, although notice should still

be given. Removal of dying trees are no longer excepted and you must gain permission from Central Bedfordshire Council.

The properties in Albion Court started to be occupied in 2007. The Town Council has arranged for work to be undertaken to the trees on two occasions in the last five years and tree work was undertaken in the Autumn of 2008 and further work in the Summer of 2012. The work to be carried out to the alternating line of Lime and Maple trees was identified by the planning section at Central Bedfordshire Council after requests from Sandy Town Council in 2008 and 2011 for CBC to inspect if any works are required to the line of trees. Far more tree work was required to be undertaken in 2008 as no tree work had been undertaken to these trees for a number of years, the tree work identified and then undertaken in 2012 was far less than in 2008 as it was only a few years since the previous work had been completed.

The tree work identified and subsequently undertaken in 2008 is attached. The tree work identified by Central Bedfordshire Council and subsequently undertaken in 2012 was as follows:

Sycamore (Maple) removal of dead wood.

Limes near Albion Court have their basal and epicormic growth removed to a height of 5 metres and regrowth from old pruning points over the gardens shortened back.

The Town Council plans to make a request in 2015 to the planning section of Central Bedfordshire Council to ask for the trees to be inspected again on a three-year cycle as recommended by the planning section, so as to identify any necessary work.

To prune the trees back to the metal fence line (approximately 1.2 – 1.5 metres from the tree trunk and approximately 1.8 metres from the planting position), would require a significant amount of crown reduction of one side of each of the trees to be removed and would result in the trees being unbalanced. If all four sides of each of the trees were reduced to the same length as the distance to the metal fence side, this would have a significant impact on the local surroundings.

Significant pruning of any of the branches could result in an insufficient amount of foliage being left to support the individual branch, large areas of the main branch wood may become dysfunctional and open to decay fungi, which could lead to branch die-back.

As mentioned above the trees are protected by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) because the trees bring amenity value to the surrounding area. The order makes it an offence to cut down, uproot, prune, lop or damage the tree(s) in question without first obtaining Central

Bedfordshire Council's consent.

Recommendation that the trees in Bedford Road Recreation Ground are regularly monitored by the Town Council staff as they currently are and that the planning section of Central Bedfordshire Council is contacted in 2015 to ask them to arrange for an inspection of the trees.

Members are requested to decide on steps to be taken with regard to the trees growing in Bedford Road Recreation Ground adjacent to Albion Court.





### 10 One Way for East Road Report from Clir Aldis

It has been suggested that East Road should be one way from St Neots Road around to the junction with Longfield Road. Longfield Road to St Neots Road would also become one-way. Currently traffic is prohibited from entering Longfield Road from St Neots Road by "No Entry" signs but the road is not restricted. Glebe Road would continue to be two way throughout its length as at present.

The advantages of this idea are seen as providing more on road parking provision and better highway safety as there would be an avoidance of doubt in Longfield Road as to whether it was one way or not. The dangerous access off East Road onto St Neots Road would also be eliminated.

The disadvantages are seen as an increase in the amount of traffic exiting from Longfield Road next to the corner shop and near the already busy junction of West Road near the zebra crossing. Additionally concerns have been expressed about the narrowness of Longfield Road and the inadequate width of the pavements to accommodate the volume of pedestrian traffic and the width of mobility scooters or buggies. The scheme would also not prevent the use of East Road as a "rat run" by commuters to avoid the build-up of queuing traffic at the town centre roundabout.

An informal consultation exercise has been carried out in the local area via a political circular. There have been very few objections to the suggestion.

Members are asked to consider whether they would support the proposal and what amendments (if any) that they would like to see added to the scheme. If agreed a recommendation would go forward for consideration by Central Bedfordshire Council Highways Department. There would be a cost for design, formal consultation, signage, Road Traffic Orders etc.

### 11 Street Lighting Deputy Clerk's Report

Members may recall that at the Town Council meeting on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2011 **(50/2011-12)** a report from the Deputy Clerk and two recommendations from the PP&OS Committee made at a meeting on 18 July 2011 were received and considered.

**It was resolved:** to authorise replacement of 17 streetlight columns as described in the Deputy Clerk's report at a cost of £26,160 to be funded from the capital account.

It was resolved: to authorise cleaning, painting (and earthing if necessary) of 7 street lights as described in the Deputy Clerk's report at a cost of £525 to be funded from the revenue account.

Quotation 1. One of the 7 street lights to have work undertaken on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2011 was Western Way opposite Manor Road, concrete column, probably hit by a vehicle, twist bracket and establish if it can be fixed. This column (S5 Western Way) was unable to be repaired. A quotation of £1600 to remove and replace the column in Western Way is attached.

Quotation 2a. Jenkins Pavilion. The Town Council's street lighting engineer has advised that the lighting installed is allowing water in to the lanterns and causing them to fail, he also advised that the number of street lights located near the Jenkins Pavilion is excessive. A quotation of £1400 is attached to fit 4 replacement lanterns, switch off six columns and re-light column 1.

Quotation 2b. Jenkins Pavilion, seal off and remove the six remaining switched off columns. A quotation of £750 is attached.

Quotation 3. Brook End (S1) Beeston, the Town Council's street lighting engineer has recommended that column be replaced as the top assembly is unsafe. A quotation of £1600 is attached.

Quotation 4. East Road (S3), following a site meeting with the Town Council's street lighting engineer and the Deputy Town Clerk urgent works were carried out to remove the existing light, the cost for the work that has been undertaken was paid out of the lighting maintenance budget. A quotation of £1600 to supply and fit a replacement column is attached.

The total cost to have all the work mentioned above is £6950.

The current lighting maintenance budget has £1510 available after all other known bills for this financial year. If the £1510 was used towards

any of the above quotations, this would leave no money available within this budget code for any emergency works that may be needed in the rest of the financial year for the Town Council's street lighting. Members are reminded that more than half of the financial year remains and on a number of occasions in previous year's a street light(s) has needed to be replaced due to cold weather splitting open the column.

Members are requested to decide if they would like to proceed with any of the five quotations. Members are reminded that the contingency budget for this financial year has already been committed, members could also consider using the capital budget or defer the item so that it forms part of the Town Council's budgeting process for 2014/15.

Following on from our recent works to the 'out of light' column S1 in Brook End, Beeston, it was found that the top of the column casting and associated bracket spigot have corroded and split, causing the top assembly to become unstable — a photograph showing the problem is enclosed. for this reason on safety grounds, we would recommend that this column be duly replaced at the council's convenience.

We would estimate that the cost of a new 5mtr. galvanised steel column, to complete with new 36 watt low energy PL lantern and all internal wiring and switching devices, excavation and reinstatement works, together with EDF Energy incurred column transfer charges to be £1600.00 plus VAT current.

Following on from our discussion about where we tried to fit a metal sleeve to this column at bracket height to bring the column back to the correct angle, I can confirm that the existing concrete bracket has corroded to the actual column and a severe crack is apparent at high level, running round the top of the bracket. This has caused water ingress into the concrete further, causing some steel reinforcing rods to become exposed. Because of this, we would recommend to you that you condition replacing this complete column in the near future.

With this in mind, we can supply, wire and fit one 5mtr. galvanised tubular steel column, complete with one Industria Libra lantern(as previously used) and carry out all ground works, together with EDF column transfer charges:
