

## DOCUMENTS TO PROVE RIGHT TO WORK IN UK

- (A) Please bring one of the following documents to your interview:
- a passport demonstrating that the holder is a British citizen or has the right of abode in the UK
  - a National Passport or National Identity Document showing that the holder is a national of the EEA or Switzerland
  - a passport or other document issued by the Home Office which has an endorsement stating that the holder has a current right of residence in the UK as a family member of a national of the EEA or Switzerland who is resident in the UK
  - a passport or other travel document endorsed to show that the holder has a current right of residence in the UK as a family member of a national of the EEA or Switzerland who is resident in the UK
  - a passport or other travel document endorsed to show that the holder can stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay
  - an Application Registration Card issued by the Home Office to an asylum seeker stating the holder is permitted to take employment.

### OR (if you cannot provide one of the above documents)

- (B) Please bring your P45, P60, National Insurance Card or a letter from a Government Agency showing your national insurance number AND
- your full birth certificate (United Kingdom, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland), which must include the names of your parents; or
  - a certificate of registration or naturalisation stating that you are a British citizen; or
  - a letter issued by the Home Office to you which indicated that you can stay indefinitely in the UK or have no limit on your stay; or

- an Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to you with an endorsement stating that you can stay indefinitely in the UK and do the type of work we are offering.

**OR (if you cannot provide the above documents)**

- (C) Please bring your work permit or other approval to take employment issued by Work Permits UK **AND**
- a passport or other document endorsed to show that you are able to stay in the UK and can take the work permit employment in question; or
  - a letter issued by the Home Office to you confirming that you are able to stay in the UK and can take the work in question.
